

After John the Baptist is murdered, Jesus desires a time of solitude. Still, his compassion for others will not allow him to dismiss those who need him, and he is moved to perform one of his greatest miracles.

¹³Now when Jesus heard [about the beheading of John the Baptist], he withdrew from there in a boat to a deserted place by himself. The Plan B committee along with the Outreach committee has been working to devise a way to help and connect with students at MJC. We have met with Dr. George Boodrookas, who spoke here last month and James Todd, VP of Student Services. They showed us examples of Food Pantries that operate at UC Davis and Sacramento State.

Our plan is to combine this service with a supply of staples for emergencies, like the floods this year, and for any emergencies that come up within our congregation.

We plan to start slowly and see how this works. We will begin accepting donations this summer and open for serving the MJC Community on September 11 and every other Monday on going from 1 - 4 pm.

At this time, donations of bottled water, granola bars, peanut butter and tuna packs can be brought in for the Care Cupboard. In the future, we hope to add to this list as we see the needs.


