GOSPEL: LUKE 1:46-55

Mary's song, often called the Magnificat, reveals key themes in Luke's story. Her "song" is an example of ancient poetry and rhymes ideas not words, so that a pattern of repetition is part of a recognizable poetic structure. Mary's song expresses hope that God will act in both mercy and justice. Martin Luther greatly admired Mary, who had carried the title "Mother of God" since 431 C.E. In his commentary on Mary's song, Luther said "here the tender mother of Christ teaches us with her words and by the example of her experience, how to know, love and praise God." God often works through the lowly & the unlikely in unexpected ways and in unexpected places.
