PRAYER OF THE DAY

P: Let us pray together....

O Lord God, merciful judge, you are the inexhaustible fountain of forgiveness. Replace our hearts of stone with hearts that love and adore you, that we may delight in doing your will, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. Amen

Admittedly, we do sin against one another. Jesus issues a challenge that we forgive seventy-seven times, indicative of God's boundless mercy. When we hear the words of forgiveness in worship and sign ourselves with the cross, we are renewed in baptism to be signs of reconciliation in the world.

- ¹¹For as the heavens are high above the earth, so great is your steadfast love for those who fear you.
- ¹²As far as the east is from the west, so far have you removed our transgressions from us.
- ¹³As a father has compassion for his children, so you have compassion for those who fear you, O LORD.



For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and forever. Amen






